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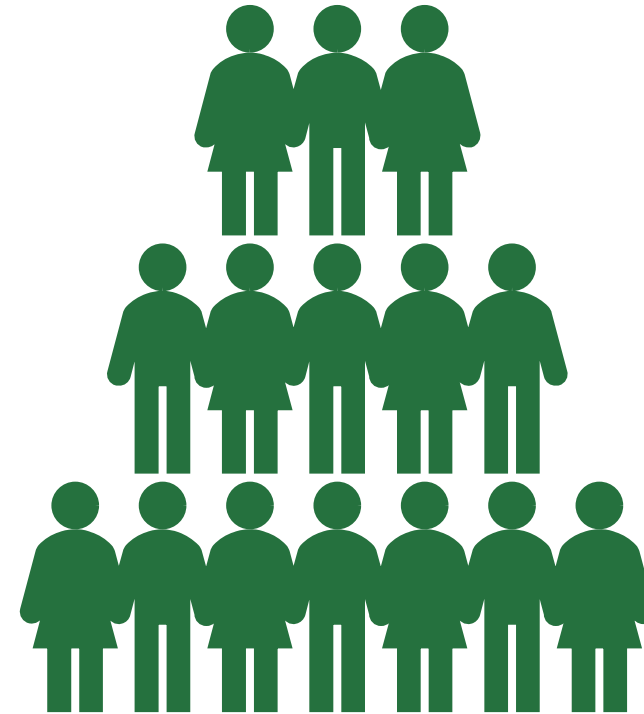
Opportunities in the Local Chapter

FASHRM Eligibility Requirements

- ASHRM member for a minimum of five years
- CPHRM designation and at least one other academic or professional designations
- At least five years risk management (*or related*) experience
- At least 75 continuing education credits in the last five years

Part Two: Contributions to the profession *(not part of their routine job description)* — must meet two of the three categories



Leadership

- provide at least two examples of risk management leadership positions within the past ten years – totaling at least four years of leadership
- Meet this requirement by serving as a Chapter Officer, Board member, or Committee chair.



Lecturing

- A risk professional must provide two examples of presentations given; one has to offer CEUs
- Giving a presentation at a local chapter qualifies since CEUs are offered.
